

Civil Money Penalty Reinvestment Program SFY 23 Approved Projects



Overview

In SFY 2023, eight projects were approved by CMS to use CMP Reinvestment Funds to improve the quality of life or care for residents of Virginia's nursing facilities. Projects will be implemented over the next one to three years, utilizing a total of \$2,318,248.53 in CMP Reinvestment Funds. The breakdown of the use of funds over the three-year period follows:

With the goal to alleviate the decline that many residents experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic, the project spreads an evidence-based intervention for improving cognitive function. The intervention is based on science and research that states simple math, reading aloud, and writing by hand stimulates the brain.

With the implementation of the iN2L program, the participating facility will be able to provide personalized life-enriching, re-engaging, and redirecting activities to residents, resulting in an increased quality of life for all participants. The iN2L program aims to create experiences focused on each individual resident to foster camaraderie, meaning, and a sense of purpose. These personal experiences will enhance the quality of life of nursing facility residents.
