UPDATES TO PROJECT CATEGORIES & FUNDING CAPS

Within the scope of allowable uses of CMP Reinvestment funds, CMS and DMAS further categorize projects into the following focus areas:

Resident or Family Council: Projects that focus on resident and family council development or improvement in resident centered services.

LIMIT: \$5,000 per NF, one-time funding

Training to Improve Quality of Care:

Projects that provide training in facility improvement initiatives.

LIMIT: \$5,000 per NF, per year

Activities to Improve Quality of Life:

Projects that foster social interaction, movement, and minimize loneliness. LIMIT: \$5,000 per NF, per year, per topic

Consumer Information: Projects that share information about resident and resident representative rights, the nursing home care process, and generally anything useful that ensures quality care in NFs.

LIMIT: \$5,000 per NF, one-time funding

Projects not fitting into one of these areas may be considered "Other". Applicants shall provide sufficient descriptions of the project to provide reviewers clarity in how it benefits individuals in nursing facilities
