

## DBHDS License SUD Waiver and ASAM Crosswalk

\*DBHDS Office of Licensing will not conduct ASAM reviews of providers and will not be using ASAM Levels to determine a provider's licensing status. This guidance is to assist with the initiative and implementation of using ASAM levels in Virginia.

### General Overview of ASAM Levels

Level of Care	Type of Service
1	Outpatient Services
2.1	Intensive Outpatient Services
2.5	Partial Hospitalization/Outpatient Managed Withdrawal
3.1	Clinically Managed Low-Intensity Residential Services
3.3	Clinically Managed Population-specific High-Intensity Residential Services for those with cognitive impairments
3.5	Clinically Managed Population-specific High-Intensity Residential Services- 24 hr care
3.7	Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient Services- 24 hr nursing care with physician availability
4.0	Medically Managed Intensive Inpatient Services-24-hr nursing care and daily physician care, counseling available, severe unstable withdrawal
*Note: this level of care does not fall within a DBHDS license.

### Instructions on How to Modify a DBHDS License:

Please use the Service Modification Application found at <http://www.dbhds.virginia.gov/professionals-and-service-providers/licensing/licensing-application> when you are already licensed and want to modify the license or add a service or location. Please submit the completed form 30-60 days prior to implementation of the modification.

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The form posted online has a checklist of all of the items needed prior to adding a service.

If providing SA services and/or detox services your license should reflect this service being delivered. Contact your assigned licensing specialist to make this correction if not currently accurate on your license.

### **DBHDS Medically Managed Withdrawal Services Requirements (Medically Managed Withdrawal Services 12VAC35-105-1055.)**

**Definition:** "Medical detoxification" means a *service provided in a hospital or other 24-hour care facility under the supervision of medical personnel* using medication to systematically eliminate or reduce effects of alcohol or other drugs in the individual's body.

**Service Description:** In the service description, the provider shall describe the level of services and the medical management provided.

**Cooperative agreements with community agencies:** The provider shall establish cooperative agreements with other community agencies to accept referrals for treatment, including provisions for physician coverage if not provided on-site, and emergency medical care. The agreements shall clearly outline the responsibility of each party.

**Observation area:** The provider shall provide for designated areas for employees and contractors with unobstructed observation of individuals.

#### **Direct-care training for providers of detoxification services:**

A. The provider shall document staff training in the areas of:

1. Management of withdrawal; and
2. First responder training.

B. Untrained employees or contractors shall not be solely responsible for the care of individuals.

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**Minimum number of employees or contractors on duty:** In detoxification service locations, at least two employees or contractors shall be on duty at all times. If the location is within or contiguous to another service location, at least one employee or contractor shall be on duty at the location with trained backup employees or contractors immediately available. In other managed withdrawal settings the number of staff on duty shall be appropriate for the services offered and individuals served.

**Documentation:** Employees or contractors on each shift shall document services provided and significant events in the individual's record.

**During the admission process, providers of managed withdrawal services shall:**

1. Identify individuals with a high-risk for medical complications or who may pose a danger to themselves or others;
2. Assess substances used and time of last use;
3. Determine time of last meal;
4. Administer a urine screen;
5. Analyze blood alcohol content or administer a breathalyzer; and
6. Record Vital Signs

**Vital signs:**

A. Unless the individual refuses, the provider shall take vital signs:

1. At admission and discharge;
2. Every four hours for the first 24 hours and every eight hours thereafter; and
3. As frequently as necessary, until signs and symptoms stabilize for individuals with a high-risk profile.

B. The provider shall have procedures to address situations when an individual refuses to have vital signs taken.

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C. The provider shall document vital signs, all refusals and follow-up actions taken.

**Light snacks and fluids:** The provider shall offer light snacks and fluids to individuals who are not in danger of aspirating.
