

**Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services
Alzheimer's Assisted Living Waiver
Fact Sheet 2013**

Initiative	Virginia's Medical Assistance Program (Medicaid) was authorized by the General Assembly in 1966 and is administered by the Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS). The Code of Federal Regulation allows states flexibility in designing their own medical assistance programs within established guidelines. Virginia's Medicaid's goal is to provide health and medical care for the Commonwealth's poor and needy citizens using the health care delivery system already in place within the state.
Targeted Population	Individuals that have Alzheimer's disease, meet the criteria, and reside in an assisted living facility (ALF) special care unit and are receiving an Auxiliary Grant.
Effective Date	August 1, 2006
Eligibility Rules	An individual must be eligible for Medicaid: meet the nursing facility level of care screening criteria; reside in an ALF; be receiving an Auxiliary Grant; have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease; have no prohibited conditions
Covered Services	Services include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assistance with ADLs;• Medication administration by registered or licensed professionals;• Licensed healthcare professional services for assessments, evaluations, and coordination of services; and Therapeutic, social, and recreational programming that provides daily activities for individuals with dementia
Excluded Services	Skilled services requiring ongoing medical or invasive therapies.
Service Authorization	Initial admissions for services in an ALF must be assessed and authorized by preadmission screening teams.
Program Administration Criteria	Waiver service is administered by DMAS. The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) is responsible for the licensure of the facility. Individuals must meet the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Meet NF level of care; and• Be receiving an Auxiliary Grant; and• Reside in an approved ALF that is licensed by VDSS as a "safe and secure" environment; and Have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease or related dementia and no diagnosis of serious mental illness or mental retardation/intellectual disability or a prohibited condition.
Service Provision	ALFs employ staff to develop and provide daily supportive services for ADL assistance, medication distribution, recreation activities, meal preparation, laundry, transportation, and coordination of medical services. These services occur in a residential setting.

Definitions

“Alzheimer’s and Related Dementias Assisted Living Waiver” or AAL Waiver” means the CMS-approved waiver that covers a range of community support services offered to individuals who have a diagnosis of Alzheimer’s or related dementia who meet nursing facility level of care.

“Assisted living facility” means a congregate residential setting as defined in § [63.2-100](#) of the *Code of Virginia*.

“Auxiliary Grant Program” means a state and locally funded assistance program to supplement the income of a Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipient or an adult who would be eligible for SSI except for excess income who resides in a licensed assisted living facility with an approved rate.

“Comprehensive assessment” means the Virginia Uniform Assessment Instrument and relevant social, psychological and medical information gathered by the assisted living facility staff for use in the development and updates of the plan of care.

“Plan of care” means the written plan developed by the provider related solely to the specific services required by the individual to ensure optimal health and safety while remaining in the assisted living facility.

Quality Management Review

DMAS shall conduct quality management reviews of the services provided and interview individuals of providers delivering the services to ensure health and safety. Level of care reviews shall be performed at least annually.
