Our Role as Facilitators

Legislative Mandate for Implementing Targeted Case Management

State of Virginia TCM mandate: DMAS was directed to establish and implement a new State Medicaid Plan service, targeted case management (TCM) for "individuals with severe Traumatic Brain Injury" <u>Va. Code § 32.1-325(A)(31)(2022)</u>.



Legislative Mandate for Waiver and Neurobehavioral Science Unit Recommendations

Virginia's budget enacted in 2022 provides,

"The Department of Medical Assistance Services, in conjunction with relevant stakeholders, shall convene a workgroup to develop a plan for a neurobehavioral science unit and a waiver program for individuals with brain injury and neurocognitive disorders. ... The workgroup shall make recommendations in the plan related to relevant service definitions, administrative structure, eligibility criteria, reimbursement rates, evaluation, and estimated annual costs to reimburse for neurobehavioral institutional care and administration of the waiver program. The department shall include a rate methodology that supports institutional costs and waiver services." Virginia State Budget 308 CC.1



FAQs

Q: Where will materials be posted?

A: DMAS will post materials on the DMAS Website at: https://www.dmas.virginia.gov/for-providers/long-term-care/programs-and-initiatives/brain-injury-services/

Q: When and how will my comments be addressed?

A: Comments may be submitted to assigned written materials or comments will need to be provided during the steering committee meetings

Q: If I have recommendations for focus group participants, how should I raise them? When will we know who's in which group? If I have recommendations for work group participants, who should I submit them to?

A: DMAS will manage the list of the BIS Steering Committee (Main group) and also any focused workgroup participants and their assignments. The workgroup member lists will be shared with the steering committee as they are finalized, membership in all groups is still being developed.

Q: How soon will materials be posted after meetings? What materials will be posted (presentations, meeting notes, recordings, handouts, etc?) Will work group materials be posted? Will stakeholder materials be posted?

A: Meeting Minutes and materials used will be posted within the week following any held meetings with the exception of program content and program rules which will be held until they are shared with and discussed by the BIS Steering Committee. In addition DMAS may at their discretion, post recordings of meetings when relevant to document processes and discussions used in the working session.

Q: When is the State Plan for TCM being submitted?

A: The Case Management State Plan Amendment (SPA) must be submitted to CMS within 90 days after the service goes live, DMAS will submit the SPA by September, 2023. DMAS will begin any formal public comment processes in June-July, 2023 after finishing informal comment processes using the BIS Steering Committee members.

Q: When is the report to the legislature due?

A: If the 2023 Approved Budget requires a DMAS legislative report outlining the BIS program design and impacts then it will be due from DMAS by Early September, 2023.
