- Enhances Public Trust




Sample of DMAS Civil Rights Training e-Module Refresher Prototype



Planning Phase

- Tailor Training to Agency Needs
- Choose Training Medium
- Assess Resources (internal vs. external)
- Establish Realistic Timeline
- Promote Interactive Learning
- Engage Leadership Early



Development Phase

- Outline/Storyboard
- Legal Requirements and Applicable Regulations
- Practical Procedures for Language and Disability Access
- Use Visual Aids for Engagement

Civil Rights Refresher Training Storyboard

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
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Sample of DMAS Civil Rights Training Refresher Storyboard

- Time Management for Training




Sample of DMAS Civil Rights Training e-Module Refresher Prototype
